Certificate IV in Project Management

Overview

The boom in the resources sector in Australia over the last few years has created a high demand for project managers from entry level through to program and high level project managers.

This qualification reflects the role of individuals who use well-developed skills and a broad knowledge base in a wide variety of contexts. They apply solutions to a defined range of unpredictable problems, and analyse and evaluate information from a variety of sources. They may provide leadership and guidance to others with some limited responsibility for the output of others.

Who is the training program for?

The Certificate IV in Project Management is a qualification for those people working on or around projects who apply their skills to complete project tasks rather than 'manage' or guide a project to completion. It is an ideal entry point for those people seeking formal project management skills.

Prerequisite requirements:

There are no prerequisite requirements for individual units of competency. However, it would be expected that candidates would hold extensive vocational experience in project-based work without a formal project management qualification.

8 core units are required for this qualification as follows:
